Military Service

- U.S. Navy 1956-1975
- TM1, Torpedoman's Mate Petty Officer 1st class
- Served on the USS Barbel, USS Charr, USS Dogfish, USS Wahoo which were Barbel, Balao, and Tang-class submarines, respectively
- Served multiple tours spanning the Pacific during the Vietnam war, preparing, maintaining, and launching underwater weaponry





Rodeo Days

- Mr. McCormack competed as a bull rider in All Indian rodeos throughout Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Arizona, California, Utah, Colorado, Washington, and Oregon.
- Some of the rodeos he rode in were the Pendleton Roundup and the famous Omak Stampede. Mr. McCormack and a group of friends also liked to compete in the Wild Horse races where he once had his thumb bit off.

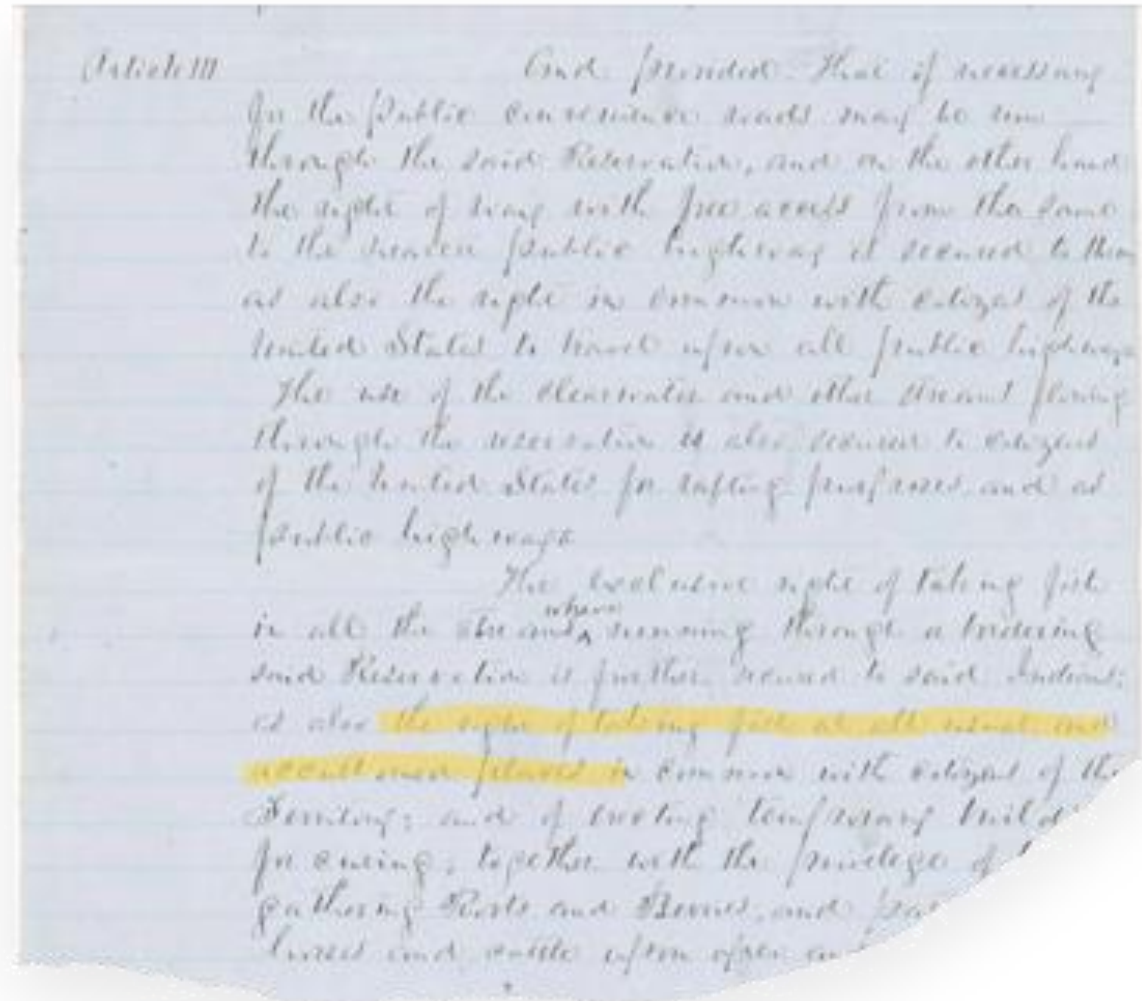

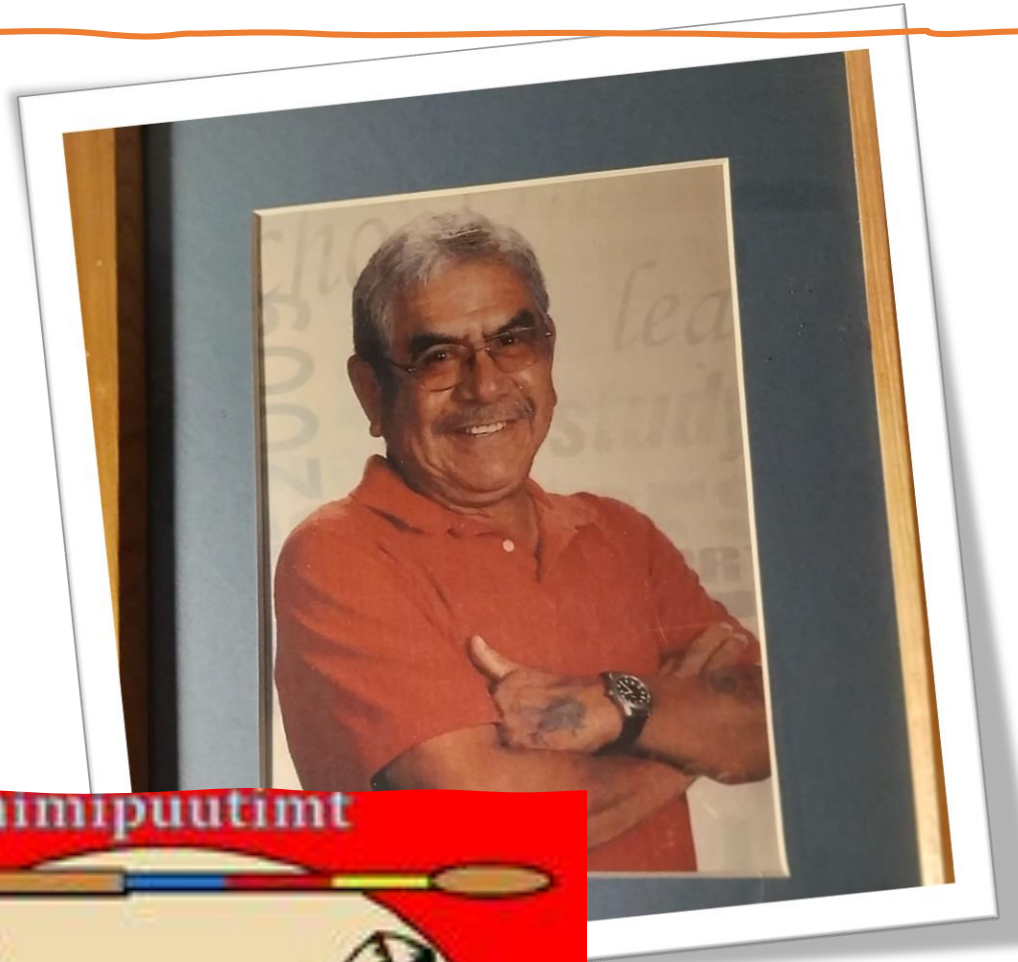
Exerciser & advocate of
